The Foundation is excited to announce that we have created a completely online application system for students, counselors, and telecommunications providers. Special Note on Tech Schools

Technical Colleges are an important resource for students and qualify for WSTF Scholarship Awards.

For example, a Wisconsin Technical College offers 115 programs, 38 Certificates, and 13 Apprenticeships.

This year the Foundation will award a minimum of twenty-four (24) scholarships to high school seniors graduating in 2024. Each scholarship will be a one-time award of \$1,500. Two-year technical college applicants are also eligible for the one-time award of \$1,500. In addition, the Foundation will also award up to five (5) scholarships to high school seniors graduating in 2024 that will be attending a two-year technical college. These two-year technical college scholarships will be a one-time award of \$1,000. Students wanting to attend a Technical College are encouraged to apply for a scholarship.

In 2023, 108 applications were received. The Foundation awarded thirty (26) \$1,500 to students this year, an additional five (5) \$750 awards to students attending a technical college, and one (1) \$1,500 award to the winner of the WSTF Bruce Reuber Memorial Scholarship.



We look forward to working with you in the scholarship process this year. We know your enthusiasm for and financial contributions to this program are the main reasons for its success. Your hard work in meeting the deadlines is sincerely appreciated by all of us!

The scholarship notifications are handed to the winners during awards night or graduation exercises at the high school the student attends. Most of these ceremonies happen in May, some in early May. Because of this, we set our deadlines early so the process is completed by mid-April.

Please deliver the enclosed scholarship flyers to the high schools in your area by December 15, 2023. The deadline for students to apply is February 10, 2024. You will receive information about how to access the scholarship portal and review the applications from students in your area in January 2024. We are also including the draft of a News Release local exchange companies can use to "get the word" out about the scholarships. If you want to let the media in your area know about the scholarships, please feel free to adapt the enclosed draft to do so.

LOCAL TELEPHONE COMPANY BEGINS SEARCH FOR SCHOLARSHIP APPLICANTS

(CITY) — The <u>(Name of Local Telephone Company or Cooperative)</u> has begun its annual search for scholarship candidates, according to <u>(Name of Spokesperson)</u>, the telephone company's <u>(Title of Spokesperson)</u>. If selected, candidates will be eligible to receive a one-time \$1,500 scholarship or a one-time \$1,000 [attending a two- year technical college] scholarship from the Wisconsin State Telecommunications Foundation (WSTF).

Each year at this time, local telecommunications providers participating in the WSTF scholarship program approach high schools in their serving areas looking for potential scholarship winners. Counselor or student submit the scholarship application to the local telephone company, which in turn forward to the Foundation. A WSTF panel reviews each application and selects the finalists based on applicants' grades, academic achievements, and extra-curricular activities.

"We're happy to have this chance to make an investment in our community by helping young people get a college education" says ______. "It makes us all proud when one of the statewide winners is selected from our area."

Last year, the Foundation awarded \$44,250 to 32 students statewide, including 26 \$1,500 scholarships; one \$1,500 Bruce Reuber WSTF Memorial Scholarship; and five \$750 scholarships to students attending a technical college. One of the \$750 Technical College Scholarships came from the Associate Members of WSTA. Since 1966, the Foundation has awarded more than \$1,841,200 in scholarships. These scholarships have helped 1,449 students.

The Foundation is part of the Wisconsin State Telecommunications Association (WSTA), which is a trade organization representing more than 65 Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers.

About

The purpose of the Foundation, which is a non-profit organization, is to promote educational and scientific advancement by helping individuals obtain instructions or training to improve and develop their capabilities. Since its inception, the Foundation has awarded over \$1,841,200 in scholarships to over 1,449 students.

Eligibilty

Students in graduating classes of high schools in Wisconsin are eligible for a Foundation scholarship. Each applicant must be endorsed by a participating local exchange telephone company. AT&T and Centurylink do not participate in the WSTF Scholarship process. If you are in AT&T or Centurylink serving areas, you are not eligible to apply for a WSTF scholarship. Academic excellence is taken into consideration but is not paramount to receiving one of the scholarships. The primary considerations are: First, the student has expressed a sincere desire to continue his or her education; Second, has demonstrated the ability; and Third, has financial need.
